ATHOLL RANNOCH SOCIETY UPDATE

The Atholl Rannoch Society (our clan's 501 c (3) tax deductible entity) was set up to support the Parent Society in Scotland. The Society's ongoing endeavors are to: (1) raise funds in support of our clan center and museum at Bruar; (2) purchase of saplings to reestablish native woodlands in the clan's name along the eastern slope of our clan moun-

tain (Schiehallion) which is owned and maintained by the John Muir Trust; and (3) support the maintenance of the clan-owned graveyard at Dunalastair where five chiefs are buried.

This summer's project is to remove two oak trees growing within the outer wall of the chiefs' graveyard. These will be cut down to remove the continuing problem of falling branches and root

damage to both the inner and outer stone walls. The two yew trees within the outer wall will be pruned and remain. If you would like to make a tax deductible donation to help support any of these endeavors, please send a check made payable to the Atholl Rannoch Society to the Branch address.



2011 BRANCH REPORT

For those of you who do not belong to the Parent Society in Scotland and receive the Clan Annual, I've re-printed here our 2011 Branch Report:

The Mid-Atlantic Branch attended 15 Highland Games and other Scottish events throughout 2011. President Sam Kistler and member Bob Land attended the Richmond St. Andrews Society's Burns Dinner in January. The Games season opened in early April with the Scots-Irish Heritage Festival in Lexington, Virginia, followed later that month by the Celtic Festival of Southern Maryland in Saint Leonard, Maryland. In May, the Branch attended the Scottish Festival and Celtic Gathering in Bridgeport, West Virginia, and the Colonial Highland Gathering in Fairhill, Maryland (in its 51st year!).

The Branch attended two Games simultaneously on June 4th – the McHenry Highland Festival in McHenry, Maryland, that we've been attending for many years (and where the author of this article first encountered the Clan in 2004), and the Bonnie Brae Scottish Festival and Highland Gath-

ering in Liberty Corner, New Jersey. These two Games were followed by the Front Royal Celtic Festival in Front Royal, Virginia, also held in June. In July, we sponsored a tent at the Grandfather Mountain Games in North Carolina along with the two tents hosted by the Branch of the Carolinas.

Our President, Dr. John Lentz, Harry Robertson, and others were in attendance.

The fall season began with the McLain Celtic Festival in Carlisle, Pennsylvania, in September. While our tent was absent for the first time in many years, our Vice-President, Ron Bentz, was nonetheless in attendance. The Virginia Scottish Games in The Plains, Virginia, were held the same weekend, and were attended by our President and a number of our Branch members. The Ligonier Highland Games were attended the following weekend.

In October, our Branch attended the Williamsburg Scottish Festival in Williamsburg, Virginia, and, to close the Games season, the Meadow Highland Games and Celtic Festival in

Doswell, Virginia. Many thanks to all of our conveners, especially former officer Jim Fargo, for all of their work throughout the games season.

As always, our Branch marched as a unit in the Scottish Christmas Walk in Alexandria, Virginia, during the first weekend in December, followed by our annual Clan Luncheon at the Fish Market restaurant.
